FROM YOUR FIRE DEPARTMENT

Please remember that burn permits are required to burn any yard waste or debris in the township. Permits can be obtained by stopping by or calling the fire station (989-686-1120 - Non-emergency line).

As most of you may know, the fire department millage could not be collected in 2024 due to an issue with the wording. The township board is working on a solution so please stay tuned for more information.


